
### Europa Donna Pan-European Conference

- ▶ Presentations by scientists and experts on topics of current interest to advocates
- ▶ Workshops and networking opportunities for advocates



### Europa Donna Advocacy Training Course

- ▶ Every year
- ▶ Comprehensive course for new advocates covering
  - Basic science and epidemiology
  - Diagnosis and treatment
  - Screening and specialist breast units
  - Advocacy techniques
  - Communication skills training



### European Breast Cancer Conference (EBCC)

- ▶ Every two years
- ▶ Europa Donna co-organises with EUSOMA and EORTC
- ▶ Unique multidisciplinary conference for patient advocates, physicians, scientists and researchers



### Metastatic Breast Cancer Advocacy Conference

- ▶ Every year
- ▶ Training in MBC science and research, advocacy techniques, successful strategies, and best practice to improve services for women living with MBC
- ▶ Idea exchange and networking on key MBC issues



### Europa Donna Advocacy Leader Conference

- ▶ Every two years
- ▶ Training in organisational management for Europa Donna country leaders
- ▶ Capacity building and fund-raising
- ▶ Training on topics of current concern: clinical trials, European health initiatives (ECIBC and EBCC), Health Technology Assessment, and more

### Breast Health Day: 15 October

- ▶ National and international breast cancer prevention campaign
- ▶ Backed by research demonstrating the benefits of healthy lifestyles from a young age

## ADVOCATING for improved breast services because breast cancer claims the lives of more European women than any other cancer<sup>1</sup> and is the leading cause of cancer death in women worldwide, accounting for 1 in 6 cancer deaths.<sup>2</sup>

It is estimated that every year in Europe:

- ▶ 576,300 new breast cancer cases are diagnosed
- ▶ 157,100 deaths are due to breast cancer<sup>1</sup>

## ADVOCATING for European policies, legislation and guidelines to guarantee best practice in breast cancer services for women in all countries

- ▶ Europa Donna played a very important role in obtaining the **European Parliament Written Declarations** “On the Fight Against Breast Cancer in the EU” of 2015 and 2010 and the **European Parliament Resolutions** on Breast Cancer of 2006 and 2003

### The European Commission Initiative on Breast Cancer (ECIBC)

Europa Donna is a stakeholder in this important EU initiative that has launched and implemented the following:

- ▶ European guidelines on breast cancer screening and diagnosis
- ▶ International guidelines on breast cancer care
- ▶ European quality assurance scheme for breast cancer services

### Europe's Beating Cancer Plan (EBCP)

- ▶ EBCP is a European Commission initiative designed to tackle four key action areas: prevention, early detection, diagnosis and treatment, and quality of life. In advocating for the implementation of EBCP, Europa Donna works with the European Commission and Parliament, also in cooperation with Transforming Breast Cancer Together, the European Patients' Forum and the European Cancer Organisation.

- Improving services and access for women living with **metastatic breast cancer**
- Establishing national and international harmonised **breast cancer registries**
- Furthering breast cancer **research** and personalised **treatment**
- **Prevention:** Breast Health Day
- **Survivorship** and quality of life

## 10 Goals of Europa Donna

1. To promote the dissemination and exchange of factual, up-to-date information on breast cancer throughout Europe
2. To promote breast awareness and breast cancer prevention
3. To emphasise the need for appropriate screening, early detection and diagnosis
4. To campaign for the provision of, and access to, multidisciplinary and specialised treatment and care for all disease stages
5. To ensure provision of quality supportive care throughout and after treatment
6. To advocate appropriate training for health professionals
7. To acknowledge good practice and promote its development
8. To demand regular quality assessment of breast services
9. To ensure that all women understand fully any proposed treatment options, including entry into clinical trials and their right to a second opinion
10. To promote the advancement of breast cancer research
